Neighborhood Watch



Green Valley Ranch has been involved in the Neighborhood Watch program since the mid-2000's, with around 50% participation among homeowners. The idea behind Neighborhood Watch is that citizen participation increases our chances of keeping our neighborhood safe. The neighborhood is divided into groups or blocks, with a block captain being responsible for each block. Joining Neighborhood Watch means that

you are on an email list to receive emails from your block captains with alerts from the CSPD about any crime related information. Your responsibilities as a block member include being alert to any suspicious activities in your neighborhood, learning your neighbor's names and being able to identify their vehicles and other vehicles usually in your neighborhood, implement security measures suggested by your CPO or Block Captain and notifying police and your block captain of any suspicious activity. Residents of a neighborhood are best able to know what activity is normal or abnormal in an area. COVENANTS CORNER

With 2018 fast approaching, the Green Valley Ranch Homeowners Association (GVRHOA) would like to say thank you to all homeowners within the community for your attention and cooperation in complying with our covenants. This cooperation assists the Board in limiting assessed fines for continued violations. Although residents periodically violate sections of the covenant rules, the vast majority elect to comply.

Currently the most common violations within our community are as follows:

1. Section 129 — Trash containers are to be placed and stored from site so as not to be visible from any neighboring property except during refuse collection days.

2. Section 132 — Yards and open spaces to be kept free from plants and weeds that are unsightly to the community and neighboring properties.

3. Section 135 — Vehicle Parking, or trailers shall not be parked overnight on any street within the subdivision. Overnight Parking Permits for occasional street use is granted by the HOA on a limited basis.

We are going into the fall season. That means bears will be in the area looking for food and to stock up before the winter hibernation. Trash containers placed out overnight the day before pick up may cause Bears to enter the neighborhood. Section 128 of the Green Valley Ranch Covenants state that "Trash Containers' are to be placed out on the curb the day of pick up only. Bears have been seen in the area and for them to tip a container over for a free meal will not take much effort. Please place your trash container out the day of pick up only.

Homeowner Tip:

Sprinkler systems need to have all the water blown out of them before winter freeze-up. If you have an air compressor you can do the job yourself and save the hefty service fee. Click <u>HERE</u> to see how.

There has been plenty painting and roof repairs within the neighborhood. If you plan to change the paint color or roof color on your resi-

dence, you will need to get approval from the HOA prior to work commencing. The HOA Board continues to keep paint schemes in harmony with colors that currently exist within the community. Please have your colors reviewed before painting your home.

Now is an exceptional time to trim your trees in your front yards before the winter. Tree trimming is needed along sidewalk areas.

Board Members are needed for the 2018 / 2019 term.
