COVENANT CORNER

Green Valley Ranch Homeowners Association (GVRHOA) would like to say thank you to all homeowners within the community for your attention and cooperation in complying with our covenants. This cooperation assists the Board in limiting assessed fines for continued violations. Although residents periodically violate sections of the covenant rules, the vast majority elect to comply.

Currently the most common violations within our community are as follows:

- 1. Section 129, Trash containers are to be placed and stored from site so as not to be visible from any neighboring property except during refuse collection days.
- 2. Section 132, Yards and open spaces to be kept free from plants and weeds that are unsightly to the community and neighboring properties. Trees along the sidewalk common areas are to be properly trimmed.
- 3. Section 135, Vehicle Parking, or trailers shall not be parked overnight on any street within the subdivision. Overnight Parking Permits for occasional street use is granted by the HOA on a limited basis.

If you plan to change the paint color or roof color at your residence you will need to get approval from the HOA prior to work commencing. The HOA Board continues to keep paint schemes in harmony with colors that currently exist within the community. Please have your colors reviewed before painting your home.

How to Achieve a Healthy Lawn



When it comes to sharing lawn secrets, the first one on many garden experts' lips is mowing height. Mowing your lawn too short stresses the grass and leads to a shallow root system. Allowing grass to grow taller promotes better root development as well as shading the ground so it doesn't dry out as fast and keeps weeds from getting the sun they need to germinate. Raise the mower deck to the highest position so you're mowing only the top third of the grass when you cut.

Most modern lawn mowers come with a mulching option. This feature cuts

grass clippings into pieces small enough to benefit the lawn. Mulching instead of bagging helps grass retain moisture and puts valuable nutrients back into the soil — up to 25% of your lawn's fertilizer needs. This works best with lawns that are moved frequently and when only one-third of the grass blade length has been removed. (continued on page 4)

Even the healthiest lawn gets hungry and needs a solid meal. Twice a year, spring and fall, is the bare minimum most experts recommend for fertilization, though some add a feeding in the middle of the summer.

When grass gets too compacted, nutrients can't penetrate to the root system where they're most needed. That's where aeration - poking holes in your lawn to improve oxygen circulation - comes in. You can aerate your lawn yourself with a simple tool that looks like two hollow tubes attached to the end of a long handle, just be careful around sprinkler lines.



Keep your mower blade sharp to get the best results from each mowing. A sharp blade cuts grass cleanly, while a dull blade tears grass, creating a jagged, uneven edge. A lawn that has been cut with a dull blade develops a whitish or brown hue as the tips of individual grass blades die back. (Source: HGTV.com)

Fireworks are illegal in Colorado Springs

The Colorado Springs Fire Department would like to remind our community that fireworks are always illegal in the city limits. All types of fireworks with a fuse and/or requiring a flame for ignition are illegal. Only novelty items (snappers and poppers) are allowed.

A fire started by fireworks that threatens or damages property is a crime of arson. Possession, use and/or the sale of fireworks is subject to a fine up to \$2,500 and/or up to 189 days in jail. All citations will demand a mandatory court appearance in municipal court. Professional public firework displays are regulated and permitted upon approval from the Division of the Fire Marshal under the city code. (Source: coloradosprings.gov)
