On the business side, we are into the final year of our three year contract with Bestway Disposal which does increase our monthly rates slightly in 2020. The optional recycling service still remains the same price of \$62/year. Bestway has changed names to GFL Environmental so the color of the truck has changed but we still have the best guy, Kyle, servicing our neighborhood. If you see him, thank him for the outstanding job he does every week! We continue to purchase our landscaping maintenance ala carte as services are needed. This spring we had to have our contractor do some trimming and removal of dead trees along Centennial so we went over budget for those services. One area of concern is still the concrete block walls on either end of the fence along Centennial. The concrete cap on the top of the wall is beginning to crack and crumble which will allow water to get inside the wall and start to cause damage. We've received bids for the repair and at this time we are monitoring the wall and planning for repairs when needed. The HOA Board voted to keep the annual dues at \$225 for the upcoming year but we may need to raise them for 2021.

Much thanks to Jeff Lawrence for keeping track of our financials and making sure we continue to run under our budget and get our bills paid. Jeff Voltattorni heads up our Covenant Committee and does a great job keeping our neighborhood looking great. If you are planning to repaint, install a new roof or make changes to your landscaping, please contact Jeff with the information so he can get the Board to review and approve the changes per our covenants.

Our Annual HOA Meeting is scheduled for Monday, February 17th, at Fire Station 18. The meeting starts at 6:30 pm and the address is 6830 Hadler View which is next to the Walgreens at Centennial and Vindicator. Please plan to attend and meet your neighbors and your Board members. 1st Place - Jeff & Shannon Lawrence (5685 Flag Way)








2nd Place (7ie) - Jay & Sharon Mullenix (2040 Butternut Trail)
